## Negator turned intersubjective speech-act adverbial [否定詞轉為交互主觀性言語行為狀語]

## Abstract

This study investigates the non-negating negator  $\bar{m}$  in Taiwanese. With respect to its function, this study argues that it is neither an intensifier nor a rhetorical marker. Furthermore, contrary to prevalent intuition, the combination  $\bar{m}$ -t $\bar{o}$  is not parallel to the ostensible cognate bújiù in Mandarin Chinese. Instead, the non-negating  $\bar{m}$  is an intersubjective speech-act adverbial affix attaching to the head of FocP (realized as t $\bar{o}$  or tsiah) that takes scope over whatever follows. Typologically, this study uncovers another use of non-negating negation in natural languages, and consequently challenges the enterprise pursuing a unified analysis for the phenomena of the so-called expletive negation.
